Dear Families,

In RE, the children learned about the Amrit ceremony and they discussed its significance for Sikhs. The children also learned about Gudwaras. They explored the practices in place and how these places of worship support the local community.

In Maths, the children have continued their work on fractions. They have been using improper and mixed fractions in a variety of different contexts.
