Children have been challenged in maths this week, subtracting numbers to 1,000,000! This has included exploring number bonds, using place value counters and using the column method to find the difference. The children have been working very hard with their regrouping and checking their work for accuracy. We have now finished this block and will be moving on next week to multiplication and division.

Our topic this half term, is the Victorians and we have been sharing facts that the children already know about Queen Victoria. We made a timeline of the key events throughout the Victorian era, many of which children could recall from their homework which I cannot wait to read!
