Dear Families,

In History this week, the children learnt about the Roman invasions Julius Caesar and Emperor Claudius. While pretending to be Celtic elders, the children role-played a debate about the oncoming Roman invasion: should they accept the Roman rule or fight?!

Melting ice-cubes was the focus in our Science lesson this week, in which the children learnt how the bonds between atoms change as temperature changes. In our experiment, the children predicted whether the ice-cube in the Petri dish or water would melt first- nearly everyone mistakenly went for the Petri dish! We learnt that the water around the ice-cube allowed for a greater heat transfer due to the increased contact with the surface of the ice-cube.

In Maths this week, the children have been working with tenths and hundredths. The children learnt the value of each digit and how to represent each as fractions and decimals. The children used a range of diagrams and manipulatives to support their understanding and address their misconceptions.

Our attendance this week was 94.4%. Well done and let's aim for 100% for next week.
